

Information about pharmacies:

If you prefer to use a local pharmacy, keep in mind that they may need to order the medication and it could take a couple of days to get it in. Pharmacies that carry **Clomid**, **Letrozole**, **Ovidrel**, **gonadotropins** and **progesterone** supplementation are listed below.

Mail order pharmacies

All medication may be ordered by mail. After calling your insurance company to verify coverage, call the office and inform us of where you would like your medication to be ordered. Also leave a telephone number that we can include with your order. You should hear from the pharmacy the same day the order is placed. They will then call you to verify insurance information and set up a delivery date. At the time of delivery, a signature is required. If this is an inconvenience, you may have your order shipped to our office. Turn around time is generally 24 hours. Be careful around weekends, no mail is delivered on Sundays or Holidays.

Michigan Center will take care of the initial ordering of medication and supplies, including refills. However, it is your responsibility to keep track of your medication and request a refill (from the pharmacy) when needed.

If you do not have insurance coverage for fertility medication, mail order pharmacies are typically more cost-effective.
